A lot of these ornaments bring me some Christmas joy.

The Harley-Davidson one that Tyler's mom gave to us before she passed. The other one that makes me sad: the broken seashell we brought back from the Bahamas 9 years ago...why do we still keep it??!?? Every year I look at it and wonder: do we throw it away? And every year, it gets put back in the bag just so I can wonder the same question next Thanksgiving.

Christmas can be like that: sometimes the rhythms of the season bring us immense joy in celebrating the birth of our King. Sometimes it brings us intense sadness knowing there will be an empty seat at the table from now on. And sometimes: it's just broken and we don't know what to do with it. And if you're _____ (?) enough: you get all three all in the same season.

Traditions are all about knowing what to expect. But we can't always anticipate what life brings us. But we can always expect to God show up in the midst of life. When the smile on our face can't get any bigger, He's there. When our grief is so profound, He's there. When we're not sure how to fix what's broken, He's there.

Do me a favor this holiday season? Start a tradition. Or honor the end a tradition. Or fix-up a tradition to make it better. Do whatever it takes to feel God's presence this Christmas season. Because His tradition of showing up, is something we can *always* expect.
